Due diligence must still be observed in relation to right to work checks (and records) both for existing (non-EU) employees, and newcomers to your organisation. It remains an offence to knowingly employ anyone who does not have the right to work in the UK. As of 30 March 2020, temporary changes have been made, in order to make it possible for employers to meet their obligations in ensuring right to work checks are carried out.

All activities which involve personal data of any kind, in any way, must comply with data protection legislation (the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and Data Protection Act 2018 (DPA)).

These are known as "keeping-in-touch" days. Any work carried out on a day shall constitute a day's work for these purposes. The University has no right to require you to carry out any work, and you have no right to undertake any work, during your maternity leave. The Home Office has issued a right to work checklist to help with checking eligibility to work. You can ask the person to provide documents specified on one of two lists identified by the Home Office. Documents must be originals: copies will not be accepted.
